FIRST LESSON

Genesis 6: 9 – 22; 7: 11 – 23

In the middle of judgment, God came in grace to rescue Noah and his family. As Noah worked and walked in the light, he heeded God's warnings and trusted God's promises. He watched; he waited; he prepared.

This is the account of Noah. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked with God. Noah had three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth. Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an

end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. This is how you are to build it: The ark is to be 450 feet long, 75 feet wide and 45 feet high. Make a roof for it and finish the ark to within 18 inches of the top. Put a door in the side of the ark and make lower, middle and upper decks. I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish. But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark—you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you. You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you. Two of every kind of bird, of every kind of animal and of every kind of creature that moves along the ground will come to you to be kept alive. You are to take every kind of food that is to be eaten and store it away as food for you and for them."

Noah did everything just as God commanded him. In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the seventeenth day of the second month—on that day all the springs of the great deep burst forth, and the floodgates of the heavens were opened. And rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights. On that very day Noah and his sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth, together with his wife and the wives of his three sons, entered the ark. They had with them every wild animal according to its kind, all livestock according to their kinds, every creature that moves along the ground according to its kind and every bird according to its kind, everything with wings. Pairs of all creatures that have the breath of life in them came to Noah and entered the ark. The animals going in were male and female of every living thing, as God had commanded Noah. Then the LORD shut him in. For forty days the flood kept coming on the earth, and as the waters increased they lifted the ark high above the earth. The waters rose and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the surface of the water. They rose greatly on the earth, and all the high mountains under the entire heavens were covered. The waters rose and covered the mountains to a

depth of more than twenty feet. Every living thing that moved on the earth perished—birds, livestock, wild animals, all the creatures that swarm over the earth, and all mankind. Everything on dry land that had the breath of life in its nostrils died. Every living thing on the face of the earth was wiped out; men and animals and the creatures that move along the ground and the birds of the air were wiped from the earth. Only Noah was left, and those with him in the ark.



GOSPEL Matthew 24:36-44

The certainty of Christ's coming is never in question. Only the timing is in question as no one knows the day or the hour. Therefore, Jesus tells us to keep watch and be ready.

No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left. "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come. But understand this: If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.








THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent wreath is a contribution of German and Scandinavian traditions. It developed out of the simple use of an evergreen spray of fir, spruce, balsam, or pine placed near the hearth. The evergreen of the wreath represents the life that is found in Christ. The greens are in contrast to the outdoors, where nature has begun its winter sleep. Midst the drabness of nature the evergreen branch symbolizes the continuation of life. In the home it is placed on a central table. In the church it is usually suspended above the altar or set on a pedestal. The light of the candles reminds us of Christ, the light of the world, so it is not at all strange that the Christian church has given the candle a prominent place in the observance of Advent. It is the living light, the living flame, that gives the candle its meaning, because the gospel light of Christ is itself a living power. This is what makes it more symbolic than artificial lights. Jesus is the light that broke forth on the world on the first Christmas when he was born as Prince of Peace. He is the light that gradually penetrated into all the world. The traditional act of lighting one more candle each week tells of the increasingly brighter light of the Messiah's coming and leads gradually to the blaze of light at the dawning of Christmas.

1st Sunday in Advent Jeremiah 33: 14 16 (Blue)
The Prophecy Candle honors those who spoke His promises

2nd Sunday in Advent Malachi 3: 14 (Blue)
The Bethlehem Candle symbolizes the preparations made for Him.

3rd Sunday in Advent Zephaniah 3: 14 17 (Pink)
The Shepherds Candle honors the first to spread the good news.

4th Sunday in Advent Micah 5: 2 5a (Blue)
The Angels Candle celebrates the joy of Gods grace to mankind.

ADVENT PARAMENTS

<u>Advent</u> comes from a Latin word which means coming.

<u>Paraments</u> are the fabric hangings on the altar, pulpit and lectern.

The paraments are blue, which symbolizes two things: 1) the sky and heaven, from which Jesus came the first time and to which he will take all who believe in him when he comes again; and 2) That Jesus is of royal - yes, heavenly - lineage.

Jesus' royalty is also symbolized by a crown on the <u>altar paraments</u>. Beneath each crown is a cross. If you look at it up close, you will see it is a cross made from three spikes. That reminds us of why Jesus came to earth: to be pierced for our sins and to give up his life in death in our place. For coming to earth on that awful and yet also awesome mission, we hail, honor, and praise Jesus (actions symbolized by the raised palm braches at the foot of each cross.)

<u>The lectern parament</u> reminds us that honoring and praising Jesus isn't merely a thing between him and us. Trumpets suggest that it is sometimes used to announce that someone great is coming or something great is about to be proclaimed. "Who" and "what" are symbolized behind the trumpets. Again, we see a manger, but growing from it are branches with buds or leaves. They symbolize Jesus' own words (John 10:10) that he entered earthly life so that we *may have life and have it to the full* (i.e., the life of faith, the life of heaven, and being alive to and for God and his Christ here and now).

<u>The pulpit parament</u> reminds Advent Christians to be outward thinking and working. It does that by means of a "square" cross, sometimes called the Jerusalem cross. Between the arms are four burning lamps, shining light and wisdom in all directions. To the right are the letters IHS, the first three letters of the Greek words for "Jesus our Savior." That light and wisdom of God, which we see and hear proclaimed from the pulpit, are to be shared by us with all the world, as Jesus himself said: *You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth* (Acts 1:8).
