A Shepherd's Message

On Memorial Day every year, flags are lowered to half-staff to honor the memory of those who gave their lives defending this nation. But this year, all over the United States, flags were lowered to half-staff the entire weekend. This extraordinary gesture was intended to mark and to mourn a tragic milestone our nation has just officially passed, though in reality we likely passed it long ago: 100,000 lives lost to the COVID-19 virus.

Every year, Memorial Day commemorates lives sacrificed in battle. Maybe this year it seems more personal because we have all been sacrificing something of our lives in a battle to defend the people of our nation against sickness and death. Some are risking their health in hazardous workplaces. Others are facing financial peril as their hours are slashed at work, or their jobs are gone. Did you have a wedding, graduation, or even a much-needed vacation that didn't happen? We have all forgone many things that in a more normal time we take for granted: gathering for worship, hanging with friends, going to the ballpark or a concert or the beach. Hundreds of millions of people have sacrificed — and will likely sacrifice much more — to save an unknown number of people we will never meet.

The true cost of fighting COVID-19 will be beyond staggering. The question it raises is both inevitable and understandable: Is it worth it? Are the lives saved worth the cost of saving them? It is also a question that Christians, at least, will have no trouble answering. Christians — to the extent that we are indeed Christian — are pro-life, because we know that every life has infinite value. The Son of God purchased every life — including our own sinful lives — with his own holy life and his innocent suffering and death.

In his First Letter, St. John draws a conclusion that is all the more powerful for its simplicity: "Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And

we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers & sisters." (1 John 3:16)

Even in human terms, every life requires sacrifice. The mother who carries a yet-to-be-born child to term knows that she will spend the rest of her life caring for that child. It will cost her in every way – physically, financially, emotionally, maybe professionally or socially. What will she do? She will lay down her life. The same is true of the father who stays with that mother and child. It will cost him opportunities to make his life about something else. What will he do? He will lay down his life. Grown children whose now elderly parents' health is failing are faced with needs and expenses that only grow as time goes on. What will they do? They will lay down their lives.

Our nation is now faced with clear evidence of a tragic and shameful reality that we may well have been ignoring. The poorest and most neglected segments of our society – the ones whom Jesus certainly had in mind when he spoke of "the least of these brothers and sisters of mine" (Matthew 25:40, 45) – have proven to be the most vulnerable to this deadly virus. No one can know what it would actually cost us as a nation to change entire structures and systems that have allowed so many to remain so vulnerable. What if, measured in dollars and opportunities, the cost is predictably daunting? What if we will have to sacrifice some of our standard of living so that others can just go on living? Are those lives worth it? The pro-life answer is clear: We will lay down our lives.
