For your comfort and convenience we have Large Print Bulletins, Hearing Devices, Crutches, and Wheelchairs. If the previously mentioned items would be helpful to you or if you desire any other assistance please contact an usher, they will be happy to help you.

For those unable to join us in person, our Sunday morning worship services are streamed live at <u>www.gsdg.org</u>. We also make audio recordings of our worship for our shut-ins and anyone else who might wish to make use of them or pass them along to others. Please ask an usher for details. So that we may have a record of your visit, we ask you to sign the Friendship Register which is a small maroon book located at the end of each pew.

Our Practice of Holy Communion

Believing that Holy Scripture teaches that Holy Communion is intended for those who are truly one in faith, this congregation practices Close Communion. This means that Holy Communion is reserved for those who are members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church or other WELS and ELS churches. If you wish to join us in the future, please speak with one of our pastors after worship.

¹Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. ²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. ³A voice of one calling: "In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD^[a]; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.^{[b] 4} Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. ⁵ And the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all people will see it together. SECOND LESSON

Avoid any distractions that could keep you from being ready for the Lord's return, because the Lord's promise of his final coming to rescue and save you will be kept, just as the promise of his first coming was kept.

⁸ But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. ¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.^[a] ¹¹ Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives ¹² as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming.^[b] That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. ¹³ But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells. ¹⁴ So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him.

Mark 1:1-8

John the Baptizer, God's final advance man for Jesus, was a very lowly man, but he delivered a powerful message of repentance and forgiveness that would make people who received that message ready for the only one who is truly great.

¹The beginning of the good news about Jesus the Messiah,^[a] the Son of God,^{[b] 2} as it is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way"^[g]—³"a voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'"^{[d] 4} And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey.⁷ And this was his message: "After me comes the one more powerful than I, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with^[a] water, but he will baptize you with^[f] the Holy Spirit."

CONFESSION OF SINS

- M: Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded baptism when he said: "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." All of us are born into this world with a deep need for baptism. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature; we are without true fear of God and true faith in God and are condemned to eternal death. But Jesus took away our sin by giving his life on the cross. At our baptism he clothes us with the robe of his righteousness and gives us a new life. Our sinful nature need not control us any longer. We recall what baptism means for our daily lives as we speak these words:
- C: Baptism means that the sinful nature in us should be drowned by daily sorrow and repentance, and that all its evil deeds and desires be put to death. It also means that a new person should daily arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.
- M: As baptized children of God we confess our sins:

- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son (+) and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart (+) to mark you as a redeemed child of Christ.

Endowment Funds – Future Impact

All of us, individually and collectively, want to believe that we can make a difference. We look for ways to use our time, our talent, our money to make positive changes in our world. However, we often feel frustrated by the short-term duration of the work that we do. We work hard to plan and budget wisely, every year, year after year. Well, we can't effectively plan several years of annual budgets all at once, and we can't effectively organize more than one year's stewardship emphasis at a time, but we can take some other steps that will have a long-term positive impact on our congregation.

Finding ways to grow our endowment fund is one of those steps. It is a repository for long-term gifts from many donors. It is also a resource for long-term plans and projects, including our current vision planning effort that may not find sufficient resources in annual budgets. The principal of the fund is invested and preserved for the long-term future of the congregation, and the income (or part of it) is spent on current needs.

Some of the benefits that may be realized from Good Shepherd's Endowment Fund that enhance Kingdom work include:

- Facilities expansion
- Scholarships for needy students
- Expanded fellowship activities
- Additional full-time called worker
- Expanded outreach programs and new ministries
- A more flexible ministerial budget

The endowment fund is shaped to meet the needs of our congregation. We invest our endowment funds for long-term growth and spend only part of each year's income. A portion of the income remains in the fund, building a buffer against inflation and future market fluctuations. In this way, gifts to the endowment fund are gifts that keep on giving year after year.
