This morning's focus: Each of us battles with temptation every day, and the results are too obvious to mention. Christ was no stranger to temptation, either. He battled, yet was without sin...for us and for our eternal life. This message of victory gives us confidence as we journey through the wilderness of sin in true repentance.

The Season of Lent

The word Lent comes from an Old English word for Spring ("lengten," the time of the year when the days grow longer). For the last 1,700 years, the Church has set aside the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter as a time of special preparation (the Church speaks of 40 days of Lent because they do not count the Sundays, which retain their significance as "little Easters.") It is a time of repentance and renewal. The color of the season is purple, the ancient color of royalty. We remember our King Jesus, who wore a crown of thorns, and carried a cross for us.

During Lent, our rejoicing is muted as we remember our Lord's suffering and death. But it is with a purpose: we know that the Lord who died took up his life again on Easter Sunday morning. So our 40 days of Lent are ones lived in the certain hope of the resurrection. Thanks be to God!

We Come into the Presence of God

Instruction for the Beginning of Lent

M: Brothers and sisters in Christ, God created us to know joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. By our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment but to turn to him and live. Therefore, God in his mercy has sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take our place under the law, to suffer for us, and to die the death we deserve. God made Jesus, who had no sin, to be sin for us so that in him, we might become the righteousness of God.

During the 40 days of Lent, we fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of God.

The time of Lent reminds us that to know Christ and the power of his resurrection, we must also know the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death. As disciples of the Lord Jesus, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor.

A Lenten Litany of Confession and Absolution

Minister: As we begin the season of Lent – a season for reflection and repentance, let us examine our own personal lives according to God's Ten Commandments.

Congregation: It is God who made us, who redeemed us, who calls us to be holy, and who has given us his holy Word.

M: "You shall have no other gods." *Exodus 20:3*

C: We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

- M: "You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God." *Exodus 20:7*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not use his name to curse, swear, lie, or deceive, or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.
- M: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." Exodus 20:8
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and his Word, but regard it as holy and gladly hear and learn it.
- M: "Honor your father and mother, that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." *Exodus 20:12*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve, and obey them, and give them love and respect.
- M: "You shall not murder." Exodus 20:13
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and befriend him in every bodily need.
- M: "You shall not commit adultery." Exodus 20:14
- C: We should fear and love God that we lead a pure and decent life in words and actions, and that husband and wife love and honor each other.
- M: "You shall not steal." Exodus 20:15
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not take our neighbor's money or property, or get it by dishonest dealing, but help him to improve and protect his property and means of income.


- M: "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor." *Exodus 20:16*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, or give him a bad name, but defend him, speak well of him, and take his words and actions in the kindest possible way.
- M: "You shall not covet your neighbor's house." *Exodus 20:17a*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not scheme to get our neighbor's inheritance or house, or obtain it by false claims, but do all we can to help him keep it.
- M: "You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, workers, animals, or anything that belongs to your neighbor." *Exodus 20:17b*
- C: We should fear and love God that we do not force or entice away our neighbor's spouse, workers, or animals, but urge them to stay and do their duty.
- M: What does God say about all these commandments?
- C: He says, "I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love me and keep my commandments." Exodus 20:5,6
- M: What does God tell us about ourselves in his holy Word?
- C: He says that I am a sinner and deserve only his punishment.
- M: Let us, then, confess our sins to God and plead for his mercy.
- C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

M: God, our heavenly Father does not desire the death of sinners but rather that they turn form their wickedness and live. He sent his one and only Son to keep the Law perfectly for you, and to pay for all your transgressions with his innocent suffering and death. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son ♣ and of the Holy Spirit.

First Reading: Deuteronomy 26:5-10


