

#### **Responsive Litany**

#### Congregation: Amen.

- M: Give thanks to the Lord, call on His name.
- C: Make known among the nations what He has done.
- M: Sing to Him, sing praise to Him;
- C: Tell of all His wonderful acts.
- M: Let us enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise.
- C: Give thanks to Him and praise His name.
- M: O heavenly Father, how good You are to us! Day after day You pour out blessings upon us, showering us with gifts of food and drink, clothing and shoes, money and goods, family and friends. We are unworthy of all the kindnesses which You've shown to us. Forgive us, Lord!
- C: Forgive us, Lord, for shallow thankfulness. Rather than giving thanks for Your gifts, we selfishly complain, and foolishly worry. Forgive us for doubting Your care, for focusing too much on this life, and too little on eternal life. Have mercy on us, 0 God!
- M: Take heart, children of God, for God has given You the greatest gift of all—the gift of His Son. Jesus lived, died, and rose—all for you. Because of Jesus, your sins are forgiven and washed away, they are removed from you as far as the east is from the west.
- C: O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good!

M: The Lord is the great God, the great King above all "gods."

M: The sea is His for He made it!


# C: His hands formed the dry lands.

# We Listen

## First Meditation: Deuteronomy 8:10-18

<sup>10</sup>When you have eaten and are satisfied, praise the Lord your God for the good land he has given you. <sup>11</sup>Be careful that you do not forget the Lord your God, failing to observe his commands, his laws and his decrees that I am giving you this day. <sup>12</sup>Otherwise, when you eat and are satisfied, when you build fine houses and settle down, <sup>13</sup>and when your herds and flocks grow large and your silver and gold increase and all you have is multiplied, <sup>14</sup>then your heart will become proud and you will forget the Lord your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery. <sup>15</sup>He led you through the vast and dreadful wilderness, that thirsty and waterless land, with its venomous snakes and scorpions. He brought you water out of hard rock. <sup>16</sup>He gave you manna to eat in the wilderness, something your ancestors had never known, to humble and test you so that in the end it might go well with you. <sup>17</sup>You may say to yourself, "My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me." <sup>18</sup>But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms his covenant, which he swore to your ancestors, as it is today.

### The First Article of the Apostles' Creed with Luther's Explanation

#### I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God created me and all that exists, and that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

And I believe that God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, property and home, spouse and children, land, cattle, and all I own, and all I need to keep my body and life. God also preserves me by defending me against all danger, guarding and protecting me from all evil. All this God does only because he is my good and merciful Father in heaven, and not because I have earned or deserved it. For all this I ought to thank and praise, to serve and obey him.

This is most certainly true.


#### Second Meditation: Philippians 4:10-20

<sup>10</sup>I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. <sup>11</sup>I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. <sup>12</sup>I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. <sup>13</sup>I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

<sup>14</sup>Yet it was good of you to share in my troubles. <sup>15</sup>Moreover, as you Philippians know, in the early days of your acquaintance with the gospel, when I set out from Macedonia, not one church shared with me in the matter of giving and receiving, except you only; <sup>16</sup>for even when I was in Thessalonica, you sent me aid more than once when I was in need. <sup>17</sup>Not that I desire your gifts; what I desire is that more be credited to your account. <sup>18</sup>I have received full payment and have more than enough. I am amply supplied, now that I have received from Epaphroditus the gifts you sent. They are a fragrant offering, an acceptable sacrifice, pleasing to God. <sup>19</sup>And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.

<sup>20</sup>To our God and Father be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

#### Third Meditation: Luke 17:11-19

<sup>11</sup>Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup>As he was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy met him. They stood at a distance <sup>13</sup>and called out in a loud voice, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

<sup>14</sup>When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." And as they went, they were cleansed.

<sup>15</sup>One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. <sup>16</sup>He threw himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan.

<sup>17</sup>Jesus asked, "Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? <sup>18</sup>Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup>Then he said to him, "Rise and go; your faith has made you well."


### Blessing
