Responsive Litany

- M: Give thanks to the Lord, call on His name.
- C: Make known among the nations what He has done.
- M: Sing to Him, sing praise to Him;
- C: Tell of all His wonderful acts.
- M: Let us enter His gates with thanksgiving and His courts with praise.
- C: Give thanks to Him and praise His name.
- M: O heavenly Father, how good You are to us! Day after day You pour out blessings upon us, showering us with gifts of food and drink, clothing and shoes, money and goods, family and friends. We are unworthy of all the kindnesses which You've shown to us. Forgive us, Lord!
- C: Forgive us, Lord, for shallow thankfulness. Rather than giving thanks for Your gifts, we selfishly complain, and foolishly worry. Forgive us for doubting Your care, for focusing too much on this life, and too little on eternal life. Have mercy on us, 0 God!
- M: Take heart, children of God, for God has given You the greatest gift of all—the gift of His Son. Jesus lived, died, and rose—all for you. Because of Jesus, your sins are forgiven and washed away, they are removed from you as far as the east is from the west.
- C: O give thanks to the Lord, for He is good!

M: The Lord is the great God, the great King above all "gods."

C: In His hands are the deep places of the earth.

M: The sea is His for He made it!

C: His hands formed the dry lands.

- M: O come! Let us worship and bow down!
- C: Let us kneel before the Lord our maker,
- M: for He is our God.
- C: We are the people of His pasture, the sheep under His care.

First Meditation: Deuteronomy 6:10-12 "Remember"

¹⁰When the LORD your God brings you into the land he swore to your fathers, to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, to give you—a land with large, flourishing cities you did not build, ¹¹houses filled with all kinds of good things you did not provide, wells you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves you did not plant—then when you eat and are satisfied, ¹²be careful that you do not forget the LORD, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery.

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Second Meditation: Deuteronomy 6:13-19 "Refocus"

¹³Fear the LORD your God, serve him only and take your oaths in his name. ¹⁴Do not follow other gods, the gods of the peoples around you; ¹⁵for the LORD your God, who is among you, is a jealous God and his anger will burn against you, and he will destroy you from the face of the land. ¹⁶Do not put the LORD your God to the test as you did at Massah. ¹⁷Be sure to keep the commands of the LORD your God and the stipulations and decrees he has given you. ¹⁸Do what is right and good in the LORD's sight, so that it may go well with you and you may go in and take over the good land the LORD promised on oath to your ancestors, ¹⁹thrusting out all your enemies before you, as the LORD said. Third Meditation: Deuteronomy 6:20-25 "Retell"

²⁰In the future, when your son asks you, "What is the meaning of the stipulations, decrees and laws the Lord our God has commanded you?" ²¹tell him: "We were slaves of Pharaoh in Egypt, but the Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand. ²²Before our eyes the Lord sent signs and wonders—great and terrible—on Egypt and Pharaoh and his whole household. ²³But he brought us out from there to bring us in and give us the land he promised on oath to our ancestors. ²⁴The Lord commanded us to obey all these decrees and to fear the Lord our God, so that we might always prosper and be kept alive, as is the case today. ²⁵And if we are careful to obey all this law before the Lord our God, as he has commanded us, that will be our righteousness."

We Respond

The First Article of the Apostles' Creed with Luther's Explanation

I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

What does this mean?

I believe that God created me and all that exists, and that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

And I believe that God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, property and home, spouse and children, land, cattle, and all I own, and all I need to keep my body and life. God also preserves me by defending me against all danger, guarding and protecting me from all evil. All this God does only because he is my good and merciful Father in heaven, and not because I have earned or deserved it. For all this I ought to thank and praise, to serve and obey him.

This is most certainly true.

M: Hear us, Lord, as we give thanks for personal blessings.

- M: Thank you for your Son, Jesus Christ, for his coming to us in Word and sacraments, for his giving and forgiving, and for listening to our prayers. Receive our gifts and offerings as our sacrifice of praise.
- C: Lead us in thankful living today and always. Amen.
