Knowledge, Attitudes, & Skills

Knowledge (Broad Objectives Grades K – 8)

1. The student will recognize proper tone and pitch.
2. The student will recognize rhythmic patterns.
3. The student will achieve mastery of the syllable system.
4. The student will develop a feeling for harmony.
5. The student will understand Lutheran liturgical worship.
6. The student will know a broad selection of hymns for personal edification and singing.
7. The student will know the necessary terms and symbols in notation, as they occur in the course, so they may intelligently use them.
8. The student will recognize music as an outlet for creative expression.
10. The student will experiment and be acquainted with musical instruments (i.e. piano, recorder, guitar, rhythm instruments, and the instruments of the orchestra).
11. The student will recognize the great classics and their composers.

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Attitudes

1. The student will recognize the art of music as a gift from God to use to His glory.
2. The student will enjoy devotional participation in worship services of all types now and throughout life.
3. The student will find enjoyment in singing.
4. The student will use Christian discernment in the choice of music.
5. The student will appreciate certain definite characteristics in the music they are expressing or to which they are listening: musical form, emotional content, beauty of tone, and character.
6. The student will learn to love and to appreciate our Lutheran heritage of church music.
7. The student will appreciate the great classics and their composers.

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Skills (How students will use their knowledge)

1. The student will be able to produce proper tone.
2. The student will strive to use perfect pitch at all times.
3. The student will be able to produce rhythmic patterns.
4. The student will be able to sing the (Do, Re, Mi) syllable system.
5. The student will be able to sing simple 2 and 3-part harmonies.
6. The student will use a broad selection of hymns for personal edification and unison singing.
